REPRESENTATIVE NEWMAN SWORN IN TO 73RD MISSOURI HOUSE DISTRICT

Representative Stacey Newman was sworn in Wednesday, January 6, 2010 as the "freshman class of one" during opening ceremonies on the first day of the 2010 legislative session.

The oath of office was administered by Appellate Judge Larry Mooney of St. Louis during the first order of business by the Missouri House of Representatives. Rep.
